From North of Pittsburgh via Route 28:

- Proceed South on Route 28 toward Pittsburgh
- ◆ Take the I-279 S/I-579 S/I-376 W/ I-376 E exit onto I-279 S toward I-376 W
- ◆ Take exit #7B/OHIO RIVER BLVD onto PA-65 N
- ♦ Continue on US-19 N
- ♦ Continue on PA-65 N
- ◆ Turn Right on W RIVERVIEW AVE
- ◆ Turn Right on W RIVERVIEW AVE
- ♦ Turn Left on **SHERIDAN AVE**
- ♦ Turn Right on LINCOLN AVE
- ◆ Arrive at **450 LINCOLN AVE**, **BELLEVUE**, on the Left

From Monroeville area:

- ◆ Take exit #1A/FORT DUQUESNE BRIDGE/NORTH SHORE onto FORT PITT BLVD
- ♦ Take ramp onto **I-279 N**
- ◆ Take Left exit #7A 7B/NORTH SHORE/OHIO RIVER BLVD (US-19) onto PA-65 N toward #7B/OHIO RIVER BLVD (US-19)

Then, follow directions given above for points north of Pittsburgh.



THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS' FUTURE...

At the annual mid-year meeting of state deputies, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson renewed a call to recruit younger members to the Knights of Columbus, saying the Order's future is at stake.

In his address, Anderson laid out a bold vision of using technology and innovative approaches to attracting new members. The centerpiece of this is the Online Membership initiative that is being rolled out gradually across the U.S. This program allows men to join the Order online, with the goal of eventually bringing them into councils and the degree process.

As part of the strategy to attract younger men, the Order announced plans earlier this year to phase out the decades-old Fourth Degree uniforms in favor of a more modern look.

Anderson noted that new additions to the Fourth Degree have nearly doubled from 2016 and that suspensions and withdrawals are significantly lower. Demand for the new uniform, meanwhile, has created a backlog. As a result, Anderson announced that the Order would extend the deadline for using the new regalia by one year to June 30, 2019.

It was the Online Membership program, though, that dominated much of the discussions during the weekend meeting. The program has been rolled out in seven states so far, with it being made available to another group of states in January. The program will be fully operational in the next fraternal year.

Online Membership will allow the Knights of Columbus to sell more insurance and to ensure it can fulfill its mission of charity, he said. "It's about bringing in more members," he said. "It's about making our local councils more dynamic. It's about the good of the Knights of Columbus, and growing the Knights of Columbus in all its dimensions."
