#### CHRISTMAS' TRUE MEANING

K of C Celebrates Christmas with donations to New Haven area charities exceeding a quarter of a million dollars.

A new home for a Vietnam War veteran and his family in Hamden tops the list of charitable donations totaling \$256,000 by the New Haven headquarters of the Knights of Columbus to area charities in 2017.

The home was built with \$75,000 in funding from the Knights under the direction of Habitat for Humanity of Greater New Haven. It is the fifth home built in the New Haven area with the support of the Knights in partnership with Habitat.

On December 22, the Knights presented a gift of \$50,000 to the Connecticut Food Bank.

"The Knights of Columbus is happy to partner with and support the great work of these organizations in our community," Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. "Whether they provide housing, food, a safe place or other kinds of assistance, the spirit of giving and help that these organizations exhibit is a great reminder to all of us of the true meaning of Christmas."

The Knights donated \$7,000 for the purchase of Thanksgiving turkeys for New Haven's annual "Day of Joy." Since Thanksgiving Day, the Knights has also given away approximately 2,000 "Coats for Kids" in Connecticut valued at \$39,000.

In the period leading up to Christmas, the Catholic fraternal organization has sent contributions to more than 20 area charities, which puts its giving for the year in excess of a quarter of a million dollars.



For those of you with a GPS unit, St. Joseph's Church is located at 825



catea at 825 2ND AVE, VERONA, PA

From North of Pittsburgh via Route 28 South:

- ◆ Take exit #11/HARMAR/ PENNSYLVANIA TURNPIKE (I-76) go 0.2 mi
- ◆ Turn LEFT on INDIANOLA RD(PA-910) - go 0.6 mi
- ◆ Turn RIGHT on FREEPORT RD go 0.9 mi
- ◆ Turn LEFT on **HULTON BRIDGE** go **0.3** mi
- ♦ Continue on **HULTON RD** go **0.2** mi
- ◆ Turn RIGHT on ALLEGHENY RIVER BLVD go 1.3 mi
- ♦ Turn LEFT on **CENTER AVE** go **0.4** mi
- ♦ Turn LEFT on **2ND AVE** go < **0.1** mi
- ♦ Arrive at 825 2ND AVE, VERONA, ST. JOSEPH'S CHURCH on the RIGHT

From downtown Pittsburgh area:

- ◆ Pass PNC Park and take ramp onto PA-28
   N go 4.4 mi
- ◆ Take ramp toward **R.D. FLEMING BR/ SHARPSBURG** go **0.2** mi
- ◆ Turn RIGHT on **BRIDGE ST** go < **0.1**
- ♦ Continue on 62ND ST BRIDGE go 0.4
- ◆ Turn LEFT on **BUTLER ST (PA-8)** go **1.0** mi
- ♦ Continue to follow **PA-8** go **0.6** mi
- ♦ Bear LEFT on GREEN BELT(PA-130) go 2.7 mi
- ◆ Continue on ALLEGHENY RIVER BLVD go 1.7 mi
- ◆ Turn RIGHT on **CENTER AVE** go **0.4** mi
- ♦ Turn LEFT on 2ND AVE go < 0.1 mi



### POPE PROPOSES WORDING CHANGE FOR THE LORD'S PRAYER...

Pope Francis isn't pleased with the words to the Lord's Prayer — specifically, the part about temptation.

In an interview with an Italian TV network, the pontiff said that the current language of the Our Father prayer "is not a good translation."

In English and similarly in Italian, the prayer asks God to "lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." But, says Francis, it's not the Lord that tempts.

"It is not He that pushes me into temptation and then sees how I fall," Francis said in Italian. "A father does not do this. A father quickly helps those who are provoked into Satan's temptation."

Francis pointed out that just a few days ago, France's Catholic church adopted new phrasing in its *Notre Père*.

"[T]he first Sunday of Advent," the church wrote, "a new translation of the Our Father will come into force in all forms of liturgy. The Catholic faithful will no longer say: **Do not submit to temptation**' but **'Do not let us enter into temptation**.'"

Among the best-known prayers in Christianity, the Our Father is "a translation from Latin, which was translated from ancient Greek, which was in turn translated from Aramaic, the language spoken by Jesus," Reuters reports.

An Anglican theologian told The Guardian that any changes to the prayer's wording could pose some risk.

"The word in question is *peirasmos* [from New Testament Greek] which means both to tempt and to be tested," the Rev. Ian Paul told the newspaper. "So on one level the pope has a point. But he's also stepping into a theological debate about the nature of evil."

Paul added: "In terms of church culture, people learn this prayer by heart as children. If you tweak the translation, you risk disrupting the pattern of communal prayer. You fiddle with it at your peril."

But the **National Catholic Reporter** noted that even after decades of debate, the change went over fairly smoothly in France, "even if some parishioners mumbled the wrong phrase": "On Sunday, many parishes passed out sheets containing the new French text, with the changed words in bold, to help hesitant parishioners along. At Saint-Ignace, the Jesuit church in Paris, the new wording was written across a large banner for all to see.

"Fr. Emmanuel Schwab, pastor of Saint-Léon Parish in Paris, said the new translation was 'less ambiguous' than the earlier wording. " 'The version 'do not submit us to temptation' made some people think God threw banana peels in front of people to see if they would slip and fall, but that is absolutely not the biblical view of God,' he said after Mass."


